RSD's 2009-10 Performance Report Omits 30% of Schools

Research on Reforms is a nonprofit foundation, dedicated to improving New Orleans public schools.

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The Recovery School District (RSD) based its 2009-10 alleged success on School Performance Scores. However, the RSD failed to indicate that 30% of its schools did not even have School Performance Scores. The RSD's alleged success omitted 30% of its schools.

In 2009-10, there were 71 schools in the RSD. A total of 21 schools did not have baseline School Performance Scores; yet, only 9 of them without scores were new schools. Compare that with the 2008-09 year, when the RSD had 66 schools, and a total of 10 did not have baseline School Performance Scores, of which 7 were new schools.

The 21 RSD schools that did not have baseline School Performance Scores in 2009-10 accounted for 30% of the RSD schools.

The RSD's alleged 2009-10 success was obviously not based upon the measures of <u>all</u> of its schools. This omission has not been reported by RSD's governing body, the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education. It is somewhat deceitful that these omissions were not considered when measuring the performance, or lack thereof, of the Recovery School District.

Tracking the Recovery School District: Schools and Student Enrollment

The state takeover by the Recovery School District in New Orleans was the result of legislation that followed Hurricane Katrina in the fall of 2005. Because of the devestation, the 2005-06 school year was for rebuilding with few school records maintained. The 2006-07 year was to be the first year for data collection to resume. Louisiana law requires the Department of Education to collect data from each school district. However, the Recovery School District failed to enter data into the system. Thus, the Department of Education reported on student data from all districts, except from the RSD. Even though the Department of Education tried to get the RSD to report data for the 2006-07 year, they were not successful. Thus, the first full year for RSD data collection following Katrina was the 2007-08 year.

Each year, for the last three years, the RSD has increased in student enrollment and number of schools. The RSD enrollment in 2007-08 was 21,623 students, and increased for the next two years to 24,832 and 26,674 respectively. iv

There were 59 schools in 2007-08 and this number increased for the next two years to 66 schools and 71 schools, respectively. Between 2007-08 and 2008-09, the number of schools increased from 59 to 66 because of the addition of 7 new schools. Between 2008-09 and 2009-10, the number of schools increased from 66 to 71 because of the addition of 10 new schools and the closing of 5 schools from the previous year. (See Table 1)

The Difficulty with the Databases

There are 69 school districts in Louisiana, plus the Recovery School District. The RSD has jurisdiction over most of the New Orleans schools, and over a few schools elsewhere in the state. Each Louisiana public school is assigned a six digit school code. For all school districts, except the Recovery School District, the code for each district's school begins with the same three digits. The New Orleans schools in the RSD at first followed this procedure. However, the codes for the RSD schools in New Orleans now begin with a variety of three digits. Thus, as the schools are ranked numerically in the Department of Education's databases, the RSD schools in New Orleans, rather than being grouped together, are now scattered throughout, making data collection a challenge.

The District Composite Report provides information on each district's schools and student enrollment. However, as of this writing, the latest year for which the District Composite Report for the RSD has been placed on the website is the 2007-08 year. Thus, to retrieve information on the RSD for the 2008-09 and 2009-10 years, other methods must be used to access Department of Education data.

Collecting current data on basic information, such as, student enrollment and number of schools, is not simple. The data is maintained on the Department of Education's website, and the process that must be followed to find that information is explained in the attached appendices.^x

Suffice it to say that all data in this report is from the Department of Education's website, and student enrollment includes pre-kindergarten through twelfth grade.

The Relevance of the Baseline School Performance Score (SPS)

The Baseline School Performance Score is the measure by which the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education determines school takeover status.

The exact score that determines takeover is not etched in stone. It changes, as has been previously noted, allowing for New Orleans schools that were not failing in 2005 to be takenover.

However, omitting the baseline SPS from 30% of the RSD's 2009-10 schools is one of the most egregious misuses of these scores. With the baseline SPS omitted from 30 % of the RSD's schools, the RSD's alleged successful performance can certainly be challenged.

The failure to record data in the 2006-07 year, and the failure to assign performance scores to 30% of the RSD schools, and the numerous other nontransparent data issues, show a continuing pattern of non-accountability.

SCHOOLS: The 2009-10 RSD Schools With No Baseline SPS

In 2009-10, 30% of the RSD schools had no Baseline School Performance Scores. In 2008-09, the percentage was 15%, and in 2007-08, it was 42%. (See Table 2)

The question of why 21 of the 2009-10 RSD schools did not have baseline SPS scores has not been answered. Nine (9) of the schools without baseline SPS scores were new schools, but one new school, Greater Gentilly, did have a baseline SPS. Two (2) of the 21 schools, Akili and Booker T. Washington, were in existence the previous year, and they did not have baseline SPS scores for either year. Amazingly, nine (9) of the schools were in existence the previous 2008-09 year, and did have baseline SPS scores for that year, but did not have baseline SPS scores in 2009-10. One school, Schwartz, is an alternative school. (See Table 3)

STUDENTS: 20% of RSD Students Attend Schools With No Baseline SPS

In 2009-10, 20% of the students in the Recovery School District attended schools that had no baseline School Performance Scores. Five schools from the 2008-09 year were closed, and ten new schools opened. Of the ten new schools, only one, Greater Gentilly High School, had a baseline score. The remaining new schools obviously assumed students from the five closed schools. The scores of students in these schools are recorded in the state's database, which would have been able to produce SPS scores for each of the new schools, if interested. (See Table 4)

Omissions in Reporting Lead to Questionable Results

Omissions in reporting data result in misleading conclusions. To say that the Recovery School District is progressing, while omitting the scores of 20% of its students and 30% of its schools, is simply wrong. Without accurate and complete data, the education experiment in New Orleans can never be assessed; and the lives of children and youth remain as pawns in a power game.

RSD's 2009-10 Performance Report Omits 30% of Schools

The Recovery School District (RSD) based its 2009-10 alleged success on School Performance Scores. However, the RSD failed to indicate that 30% of its schools did not even have School Performance Scores. The RSD's alleged success omitted 30% of its schools.

In 2009-10, there were 71 schools in the RSD. A total of 21 schools did not have baseline School Performance Scores; yet, only 9 of them without scores were new schools. Compare that with the 2008-09 year, when the RSD had 66 schools, and a total of 10 did not have baseline School Performance Scores, of which 7 were new schools.

The 21 RSD schools that did not have baseline School Performance Scores in 2009-10 accounted for 30% of the RSD schools.

The RSD's alleged 2009-10 success was obviously not based upon the measures of <u>all</u> of its schools. This omission has not been reported by RSD's governing body, the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education. It is somewhat deceitful that these omissions were not considered when measuring the performance, or lack thereof, of the Recovery School District.

Tracking the Recovery School District: Schools and Student Enrollment

The state takeover by the Recovery School District in New Orleans was the result of legislation that followed Hurricane Katrina in the fall of 2005. Because of the devestation, the 2005-06 school year was for rebuilding with few school records maintained. The 2006-07 year was to be the first year for data collection to resume. Louisiana law requires the Department of Education to collect data from each school district. However, the Recovery School District failed to enter data into the system. Thus, the Department of Education reported on student data from all districts, except from the RSD. Even though the Department of Education tried to get the RSD to report data for the 2006-07 year, they were not successful. Thus, the first full year for RSD data collection following Katrina was the 2007-08 year.

Each year, for the last three years, the RSD has increased in student enrollment and number of schools. The RSD enrollment in 2007-08 was 21,623 students, and increased for the next two years to 24,832 and 26,674 respectively. iv

There were 59 schools in 2007-08 and this number increased for the next two years to 66 schools and 71 schools, respectively. Between 2007-08 and 2008-09, the number of schools increased from 59 to 66 because of the addition of 7 new schools. Between 2008-09 and 2009-10, the number of schools increased from 66 to 71 because of the addition of 10 new schools and the closing of 5 schools from the previous year. (See Table 1)

The Difficulty with the Databases

There are 69 school districts in Louisiana, plus the Recovery School District. The RSD has jurisdiction over most of the New Orleans schools, and over a few schools elsewhere in the state. Each Louisiana public school is assigned a six digit school code. For all school districts, except the Recovery School District, the code for each district's school begins with the same three digits. The New Orleans schools in the RSD at first followed this procedure. However, the codes for the RSD schools in New Orleans now begin with a variety of three digits. Thus, as the schools are ranked numerically in the Department of Education's databases, the RSD schools in New Orleans, rather than being grouped together, are now scattered throughout, making data collection a challenge.

The District Composite Report provides information on each district's schools and student enrollment. However, as of this writing, the latest year for which the District Composite Report for the RSD has been placed on the website is the 2007-08 year. Thus, to retrieve information on the RSD for the 2008-09 and 2009-10 years, other methods must be used to access Department of Education data.

Collecting current data on basic information, such as, student enrollment and number of schools, is not simple. The data is maintained on the Department of Education's website, and the process that must be followed to find that information is explained in the attached appendices.^x

Suffice it to say that all data in this report is from the Department of Education's website, and student enrollment includes pre-kindergarten through twelfth grade.

The Relevance of the Baseline School Performance Score (SPS)

The Baseline School Performance Score is the measure by which the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education determines school takeover status.

The exact score that determines takeover is not etched in stone. It changes, as has been previously noted, allowing for New Orleans schools that were not failing in 2005 to be takenover.

However, omitting the baseline SPS from 30% of the RSD's 2009-10 schools is one of the most egregious misuses of these scores. With the baseline SPS omitted from 30 % of the RSD's schools, the RSD's alleged successful performance can certainly be challenged.

The failure to record data in the 2006-07 year, and the failure to assign performance scores to 30% of the RSD schools, and the numerous other nontransparent data issues, show a continuing pattern of non-accountability.

SCHOOLS: The 2009-10 RSD Schools With No Baseline SPS

In 2009-10, 30% of the RSD schools had no Baseline School Performance Scores. In 2008-09, the percentage was 15%, and in 2007-08, it was 42%. (See Table 2)

The question of why 21 of the 2009-10 RSD schools did not have baseline SPS scores has not been answered. Nine (9) of the schools without baseline SPS scores were new schools, but one new school, Greater Gentilly, did have a baseline SPS. Two (2) of the 21 schools, Akili and Booker T. Washington, were in existence the previous year, and they did not have baseline SPS scores for either year. Amazingly, nine (9) of the schools were in existence the previous 2008-09 year, and did have baseline SPS scores for that year, but did not have baseline SPS scores in 2009-10. One school, Schwartz, is an alternative school. (See Table 3)

STUDENTS: 20% of RSD Students Attend Schools With No Baseline SPS

In 2009-10, 20% of the students in the Recovery School District attended schools that had no baseline School Performance Scores. Five schools from the 2008-09 year were closed, and ten new schools opened. Of the ten new schools, only one, Greater Gentilly High School, had a baseline score. The remaining new schools obviously assumed students from the five closed schools. The scores of students in these schools are recorded in the state's database, which would have been able to produce SPS scores for each of the new schools, if interested. (See Table 4)

Omissions in Reporting Lead to Questionable Results

Omissions in reporting data result in misleading conclusions. To say that the Recovery School District is progressing, while omitting the scores of 20% of its students and 30% of its schools, is simply wrong. Without accurate and complete data, the education experiment in New Orleans can never be assessed; and the lives of children and youth remain as pawns in a power game.
